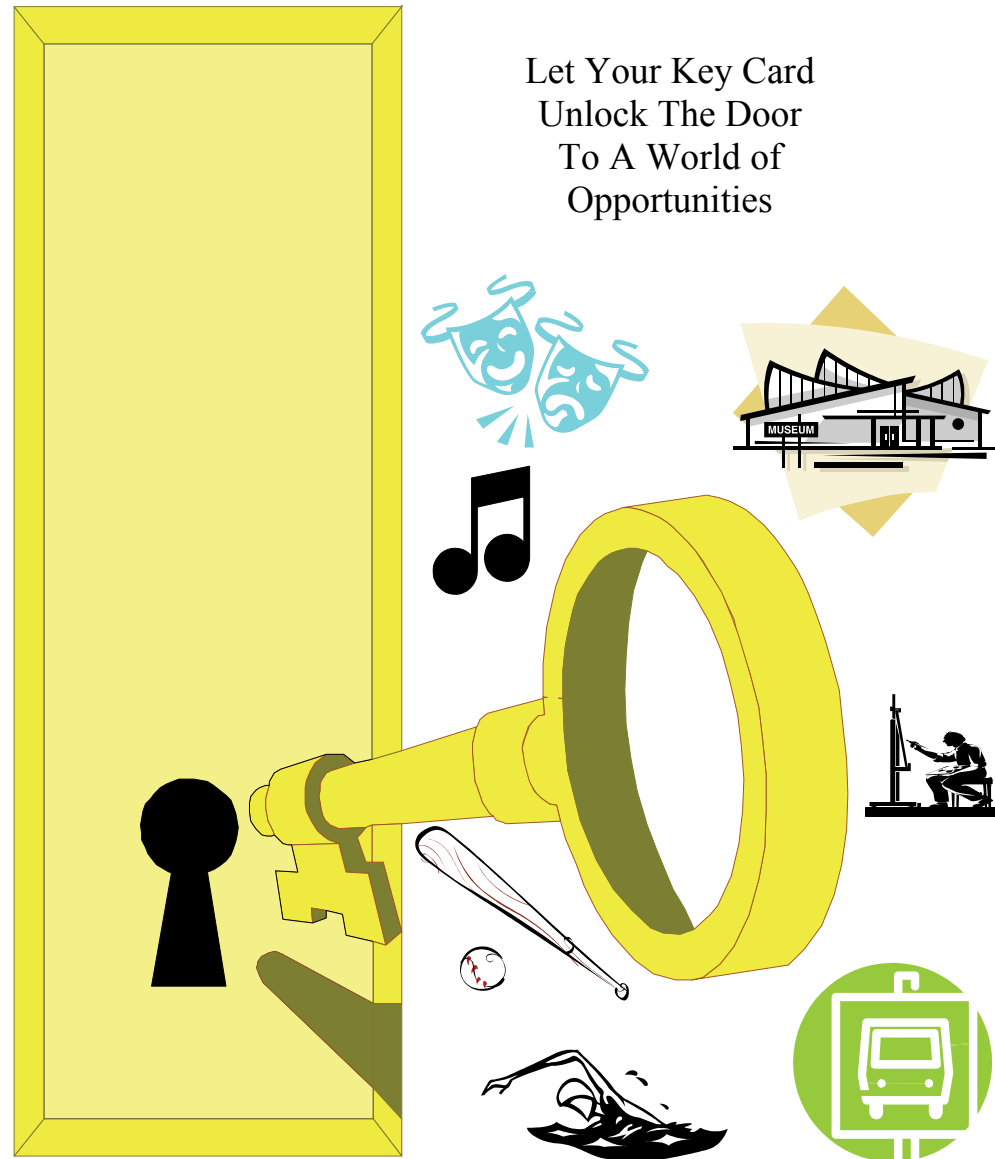

How Does a Key Card Work?

The Cedar Valley Key Card Program opens doors to recreational and cultural events for limited-income individuals and families.

A Key Card allows reduced cost or free admission for some community programs as well as bus transportation.

Eligible family members receive a Key Card I.D. through Operation Threshold. Each family is issued a Key Card at no cost that is valid for two years from the date received. Card replacement fee is \$1.00. Key Cards will be issued to an adult household member(s) and the eligible children's names and birth dates will be listed on the back of the adult I.D..

How Do I Apply For A Key Card?

Households who receive FIP, SSI, food stamps, WIC or Low Income Energy Assistance Program (Liheap) will be automatically eligible. If not on any of these programs, an appointment should be made at Operation Threshold, 300 West Third Street in Waterloo to apply. Phone: 235-6243

How Do I Find Out About Eligible Key Card Programs?

Because of the types of programs involved, some may have limited space available. This means there may be a limited amount of seating, or space available. Information on individual programs can be obtained from the Waterloo Courier or by contacting the individual programs.
